


South Pinetree Boulevard

2012 -2017

- 2012: SPLOST approved by Thomas County voters.
- 2014-2017: Thomas County contracts with Falcon Engineering to develop a design featuring 3 lanes.
- Summer 2017: Thomas County secures \$3m GDOT grant to fund road improvements.
- Summer 2017: It is determined that the City of Thomasville owns a majority of the ROW in proposed improvement area.

SPLOST Ballot Language



SECTION NINE

Ballot Language

The ballot for the question of imposing the SPLOST shall read as follows:

() YES Sha

Shall a special 1 percent sales and use tax be imposed in the special district of

()NO

Thomas County for a period of time not to exceed 24 calendar quarters and for the raising of an estimated amount of \$42 million for the purpose of capital outlay projects in Barwick, Boston, Coolidge, Meigs, Ochlocknee, Pavo, Thomasville and Thomas County, Georgia, including road, street, and bridge improvements; the construction of water, sewer, and/or storm water capital outlay projects to be owned and operated by qualified municipalities within the special district; the construction of public safety facilities and the purchase of public safety

equipment; the expansion of the Jail Justice Center; the construction of cultural and recreational facilities; and the development of the Red Hills Business Park.



August 2017

- August 9: City-County combined workshop is held; ROW ownership and responsibility are discussed as well as other options for improving South Pinetree Blvd. Both parties agree to negotiate IGA.
- August 14: City Council Workshop & Meeting is held; additional design options are presented to City Council. Several County Commissioners were in attendance. Council votes to approve a resolution to negotiate with County Commission for IGA.
- August 22: County Commission Meeting is held; votes to enter into IGA.



October 2017

• City Council unanimously votes to award contract for redesign to Falcon Engineering. Details of the two-lane plan are included in the contract with Falcon.



January 2018 Council votes unanimously to approve IGA for ownership, pending County approval.



February 2018


County Commission votes 4-3 to approve IGA for ownership.

All Plans – at Magnolia Intersection




Existing Two-Lane Typical Section




