

City of Thomasville Council Meeting Minutes, May 26, 2026

The Council of the City of Thomasville met in regular session on the above date. Mayor Scott Chastain presided, and the following Councilmembers were present: Mayor Pro Tem Lucinda Brown and Councilmembers Todd Mobley, Terry Scott and Royal Baker. Also present were the City Manager, Chris White; City Attorney, Timothy C. Sanders; Chief Financial Officer, Ashley Cason; other city staff; citizens and members of the media. The meeting was held in Council Chambers at City Hall, located at 144 East Jackson Street, Thomasville, Georgia. Simultaneous access to the meeting was provided to those members of the media and citizens unable to attend the meeting via the City of Thomasville's online live stream feed located at www.thomasville.org.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Scott Chastain called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

INVOCATION

Mayor Pro Tem Lucinda Brown gave the Invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pro Tem Lucinda Brown led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilmember Todd Mobley moved to approve the City Council Regular Meeting Minutes of May 11, 2026, as presented. Mayor Pro Tem Brown seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion passed unanimously 5-0, with the following votes recorded: AYES: Chastain, Brown, Mobley, Scott, Baker.

CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

There were no citizens signed in on the Citizens to be Heard Sign-In form for this meeting.

ADOPT AGENDA

Councilmember Terry Scott moved to adopt the agenda as presented. Councilmember Baker seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion passed unanimously 5-0, with the following votes recorded: AYES: Chastain, Brown, Mobley, Scott, Baker.

OLD BUSINESS

Consider second reading of an ordinance to amend Chapter 18, Article IV, Hotel/Motel Excise Tax, of the City of Thomasville Code of Ordinances.

City Attorney, Timothy C. Sanders, reported there had been no changes to this ordinance since its passage on first reading. He noted the change applies to Section 18-107, and provides that the use of meeting rooms and other such facilities or any rooms, lodgings, or accommodations provided without charge are exempt from tax. This section has also been modified to increase the length of stay that is subject to tax to from 10 days to 30 days, which is the maximum permitted by Georgia law.

Councilmember Scott moved to order the ordinance to amend Chapter 18, Article IV, Hotel/Motel Excise Tax, of the City of Thomasville Code of Ordinances, as read for the second time, passed and adopted, as presented. Councilmember Mobley seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion passed unanimously 5-0, with the following votes recorded: AYES: Chastain, Brown, Mobley, Scott, Baker.

The adopted ordinance follows.

ORDINANCE NO.: ORD-27-05262026

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THOMASVILLE, GEORGIA, BY (1) SECTION 18-107, EXEMPTIONS; (2) REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND (3) PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

SECTION I

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council for the City of Thomasville, Georgia, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, that Section 18-107, Exemptions, of Chapter 18, Taxation, Revenue, and Miscellaneous Business Regulations, Article IV, Hotel/Motel Excise Tax, is hereby amended as follows:

“Sec. 18-107. Exemptions.

No tax shall be levied pursuant to this article for the following:

- (1) The use of meeting rooms and other such facilities or any rooms, lodgings, or accommodations provided without charge;
- (2) Any room, lodgings or accommodations furnished for a period of one or more days for use by state or local government employees or officials when travelling on official business. Notwithstanding the availability of any other means of identifying the person as a state or local governmental official or employee, whenever a person pays for any rooms, lodgings, or accommodations with a state or local government credit card or debit card, such rooms, lodgings or accommodations shall be deemed to have been furnished for use by a state or local government official or employee for purposes of the exemption provided under this subsection. Further, for purposes of the exemption provided under this subsection, a local government official or employee shall include officials or employees of counties, municipalities, consolidated governments, or county or independent school districts located within the state;
- (3) For rental ~~over~~ after the first ten-thirty (30) consecutivecontinuous days of occupancy; or
- (4) Upon any persons who certify that they are staying in such room, lodging, or accommodations as a result of the destruction of their home or residence by fire or other casualty or natural disaster.”

SECTION II

This ordinance shall be effective immediately on the date of its final reading and passage.

SECTION III

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION IV

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED and it is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council of the City of Thomasville that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrase of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and the Council to be fully valid, enforceable, and constitutional.

SECTION V

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED and it is hereby declared by the Mayor and the Council of the City of Thomasville that (i) to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section paragraph sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other section paragraph sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance and (ii) that to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of This ordinance.

SECTION VI

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED and it is hereby declared that in the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgement or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the Mayor and the Council of the City of Thomasville that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or section of the Ordinance and that to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and effect.

SECTION VII

This ordinance was introduced and read at a lawful meeting of the City council for the City of Thomasville, Georgia, held May 11, 2026, and read the second time, passed and adopted in like meeting held on May 26, 2026.

Consider second readings of two separate ordinances to close certain alleys located within the city limits of Thomasville, Georgia.

City Attorney Sanders reported that there had been no changes to these ordinances since their passage on first readings. There was a brief discussion regarding the process of notification to owners relating to the alley closures, it was noted that under Georgia Law, once closed the full ownership of the former street or alley reverts to the adjoining landowners, each to the center line.

1. Second reading of an ordinance to close the two alleys between Cherokee Street and Reid Street.

Mayor Pro Tem Brown moved to order the ordinance to close the two alleys between Cherokee Street and Reid Street, as read for the second time, passed and adopted, as presented. Councilmember Mobley seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion passed unanimously 5-0, with the following votes recorded: AYES: Chastain, Brown, Mobley, Scott, Baker.

The adopted ordinance follows.

ORDINANCE NO. ORD-28-05262026

AN ORDINANCE TO CLOSE ALL ALLEYS LOCATED IN THE BLOCK BOUNDED BY REID STREET, CHEROKEE STREET, SMITH AVENUE, AND CECIL STREET; TO PROVIDE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, those certain alleys platted, dedicated and appropriated to the City of Thomasville, located in that certain block bounded by Cherokee Street, Reid Street, Smith Avenue, and Cecil Street, which such alleys proposed to be closed are more particularly described as follows:

All that tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the City of Thomasville, Thomas County, Georgia and being all alleys located in the block bounded by Reid Street, Cherokee Street, Smith Avenue and Cecil Street (collectively "Alleys").

WHEREAS, the City of Thomasville is vested with the authority to close the Alleys, pursuant to OCGA § 36-34-3 and pursuant to Georgia Laws 1990 (Act No. 1118), Page 5051 et seq., which is a part of the Charter of the City of Thomasville, and has been codified as subsection 33 of Section 1.12 of Article 1 of the Charter of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Alleys have ceased to be used by the City and the public as a part of the municipal street system and the removal of the Alleys from the municipal street system is in the best public interest;

WHEREAS, the City does not have a fee interest in the Alleys;

WHEREAS, ten (10) days advance notice by publication was given to all parties in interest of a public hearing to be held on April 27, 2026, in connection with the proposed closing of the Alleys; and

WHEREAS, the property owners adjoining the Alleys were delivered a copy of the notice published in the paper more than ten (10) days prior to the scheduled hearing date.

SECTION I

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that the City Council of the City of Thomasville hereby finds that Alley has ceased to be used by the City and the public as a part of the municipal street system of the City and the removal from the municipal street system is in the best public interest;

SECTION II

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Thomasville, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, that the Alleys as described herein be closed.

SECTION III

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the City of Thomasville reserves an easement for all existing utilities lying in the Alleys described herein and otherwise all title and interest to such Alleys shall revert to the adjacent property owners.

SECTION IV

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final adoption.

SECTION V

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the recitals set forth above are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth fully herein.

SECTION VI

BE IT FUTHER ORDAINED, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION VII

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED and it is hereby declared to the be intention of the Council of the City of Thomasville that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrase of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the Council to be fully valid, enforceable, and constitutional.

Councilmember Baker seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion passed unanimously 5-0, with the following votes recorded: AYES: Chastain, Brown, Mobley, Scott, Baker.

The adopted ordinance follows.

ORDINANCE NO.: ORD-29-05262026

AN ORDINANCE TO CLOSE THAT CERTAIN ALLEY SIXTEEN FEET IN WIDTH EXTENDING FROM THE EASTERN MARGIN OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF SOUTH STREET TO THE WESTERN MARGIN OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF ROSEDALE AVENUE, RUNNING PARALLEL TO WEST HANSELL STREET, BETWEEN WEST HANSELL STREET AND LOOMIS STREET; TO PROVIDE THE

EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, that certain alley platted, dedicated and appropriated to the City of Thomasville, being sixteen (16) feet in width extending northeast from the eastern margin of the right-of-way of South Street to the western margin of the right-of-way of Rosedale Avenue and running parallel to West Hansell Street lying between West Hansell Street and Loomis Street, which such alley proposed to be closed is more particularly described as follows:

All that tract or parcel of land, situated, lying and being in the City of Thomasville, Thomas County, Georgia, more particularly described as follows: Commence at the intersection of the southeast margin of the right of way of West Hansell Street with the eastern margin of the right of way of South Street and run thence south 00 degree 41 minutes, 24 seconds west along the eastern margin of the right of way of South Street a distance of 246.98 feet to an iron pin and the point of beginning. From the Point of Beginning run thence north 66 degrees, 59 minutes, 28 seconds east a distance of 212.08 feet to an iron pin; continue thence north 66 degrees, 59 minutes, 28 seconds east a distance of 117.91 feet, more or less, to a point on the western margin of the right of way of Rosedale Avenue; run thence south along the western margin of the right of way of Rosedale Avenue a distance of 16 feet to a point; run thence south 66 degrees, 59 minutes, 28 seconds west a distance of 335 feet, more or less, to a point on the eastern margin of the right of way of South Street; run thence north 00 degree, 41 minutes, 24 seconds east a distance of 16 feet more or less to an iron pin and the point of beginning (the "Alley").

The Alley was first platted on that plat of survey recorded in Deed Book Z, Page 222 among the deed records of Thomas County, Georgia. A portion of the Alley is shown on that plat of survey prepared for The Back 513, LLC recorded in Plat Book 10, Page 459 among the deed records of Thomas County, Georgia.

WHEREAS, the City of Thomasville is vested with the authority to close the Alley, pursuant to OCGA § 36-34-3 and pursuant to Georgia Laws 1990 (Act No. 1118), Page 5051 et seq., which is a part of the Charter of the City of Thomasville, and has been codified as subsection 33 of Section 1.12 of Article 1 of the Charter of the City; and

This Ordinance was read and passed for the first time at a lawful meeting of the Council of the City of Thomasville held on May 11, 2026 and second time passed and adopted in a lawful meeting of the Council of the City of Thomasville held on May 26, 2026.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution to appoint citizens to the Thomas County Library Board.

Mayor Scott Chastain reported that the terms for the Library Board expire June 30th each year, unlike the other boards whose terms expire on December 31st each year. Each appointing body reserves the right to review their representatives annually and make new appointments at their discretion, if deemed necessary, or upon the expiration of the term. Terms are limited to two successive, three-year terms. The Library Board is comprised of thirteen voting members appointed as follows:

- 3 appointed by City (city residence is required)
- 4 appointed by County
- 2 appointed by small towns with Libraries
- 4 Ex-officio Members

Mayor Chastain further explained that currently, two of the three City-appointed members' terms expire on June 30, 2026. It was noted that Debra Abrams had indicated interest and agreed to serve if reappointed. However, Ms. Janet Cable had indicated she would not seek reappointment.

Mayor Pro Tem Brown moved to adopt a resolution to reappoint Ms. Debra Abrams and appoint Mr. Arthur Wigfall to the Thomas County Library Board. Councilmember Scott seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion passed unanimously 5-0, with the following votes recorded: AYES: Chastain, Brown, Mobley, Scott, Baker

The adopted resolution follows.

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Thomasville, and it is hereby resolved by the authority of the same, that Debra Abrams is re-appointed to serve on the Library Board for a three-year term expiring on June 30, 2029.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Thomasville, and it is hereby resolved by the authority of the same, that Arthur Wigfall is appointed to serve on the Library Board for a three-year term expiring on June 30, 2029.

SO RESOLVED, this the 26th day of May, 2026.

Resolution to approve Phase 2 Rigging System Replacement for Municipal Auditorium with PointWright Entertainment Rigging Specialists.

Managing Director of Marketing & Communications, April Norton reported that Turner & Townsend Heery, project manager for Municipal Building Auditorium Renovation, has recommendation to proceed with phase two of the rigging system replacement. PointWright was selected as the rigging contractor through a competitive bid process in early spring of 2025 which consisted of three separate bids. Phase two represents an extension of phase one work completed by PointWright which was approved by the City of Thomasville on September 8, 2025. Phase one focused

on bringing the existing system to a condition of safe static operation. This work included professionally suspending the battens with new steel and hardware, eliminating all movement of the outdated system, and “locking out” the existing equipment to remove operational hazards for the remainder of the 2025/2026 season. Phase two is intended to complete the work begun in phase one by replacing the full system, restoring functional and safe operability, addressing the main curtain rigging deficiencies, and resolving all remaining issues identified in the original Georgia Stage and Theatre Projects assessments. The proposed phase two scope of the rigging system, totals \$369,350 and includes full system replacement. Funding for phase two of the rigging system has already been allocated within the life safety & code improvements budget established under the first phase of the broader building renovation. Given the continuity of the work, PointWright’s detailed knowledge of the system conditions, and the alignment of this scope with previously approved safety and operational objectives, Turner & Townsend Heery recommends proceeding with this quote by awarding the work to PointWright Rigging Specialists. There was brief discussion regarding the process of fire-proofing the front curtain.

Councilmember Mobley moved to adopt the resolution to approve the Phase 2 Rigging System Replacement for the Municipal Auditorium with PointWright Entertainment Rigging Specialists, as presented. Councilmember Scott seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion passed unanimously 5-0, with the following votes recorded: AYES: Chastain, Brown, Mobley, Scott, Baker.

The adopted resolution follows.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the City of Thomasville is responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the Municipal Auditorium, and has conducted a comprehensive facility assessment and renovation planning study; and,

WHEREAS it is the goal of the City of Thomasville’s Special Facilities study aims to address critical life safety concerns, evaluate long-term facility needs, and develop a phased renovation strategy that integrates life safety improvements and historic preservation with modernization goals and community impact – resulting in a plan that provides a clear and actionable roadmap for revitalizing the Auditorium as a safe, accessible, and vibrant civic and cultural venue and,

WHEREAS the City of Thomasville solicited proposals from qualified contractors to perform Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the Rigging System, as reported by Georgia Stage in June 2024 and the assessment of Theatre Projects in December 2024, the condition of the overhead rigging system presents a significant safety risk and liability; and,

WHEREAS, a Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued by Theatre Projects, City of Thomasville Contracted Services, with the bidding period closed on September 5, 2025, pursuant to the policies and procedures of the City of Thomasville; and,

WHEREAS PointWright Entertainment Rigging Specialist, LLC. was awarded the bid in 2025, completing phase 1 of a 2-phasesd approach to the rigging system, and,

WHEREAS, City Council for the City of Thomasville, Georgia desires to accept the quote in the amount of \$369,350 for Phase 2 Rigging to PointWright, Entertainment Rigging Specialist, LLC. as being most qualified to perform this work; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are incorporated herein by this reference as if set forth fully in this Section 1.

Section 2. Approval and Authorization of Quote. The City Council for the City of Thomasville, Georgia approves the Quote: Thomasville Municipal Auditorium Rigging System Replacement amount attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A (“Quote”).

Section 3. General Authority. From and after the approval of this Resolution, the Mayor, Mayor Pro Tempore, City Manager, officers, and employees of the City of Thomasville, Georgia are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to comply with the provisions of the Quote as executed and are further authorized to take any and all further actions and execute and deliver any and all other documents and certificates, including but not limited to the Quote, as may be necessary or desirable in connection with the execution and delivery of the Quote and any related documents, all of the foregoing in consultation with the City Attorney.

Section 4. Actions Approved and Confirmed. All acts and doings of the City Council, Mayor, Mayor Pro Tempore, the City Manager, the officers, and employees of the City of Thomasville, Georgia that are in conformity with the purposes and intents of this Resolution and in the furtherance of the Quote and the execution, delivery, and performance of the Quote and related documents shall be, and the same hereby are, in all respects approved and confirmed.

Section 5. Severability of Invalid Provisions. If any one or more of the provisions herein contained shall be held contrary to any express provision of law or contrary to the policy of express law, though not expressly prohibited, or against public policy, or shall for any reason whatsoever be held invalid, then such provisions shall be null and void and shall be deemed separable from the remaining provisions and shall in no way affect the validity of any of the other provisions hereof or of the Quote ratified hereunder.

Section 6. Repealing Clause. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions herein contained are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded and repealed.

Section 7. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon its adoption.
