AFFIDAVIT

As owner of the above referenced property, I herby acknowledge and agree to the following stipulations as outlined below and further described within the City of Thomasville city ordinances chapter 5. More specifically, I understand that I as owner am solely responsible to the stipulations pertaining to "barriers" around the pool area and that these barriers and/or fences must be completed prior to, and at all times while the pool or spa or other water features are filled.

- 1. Prior to installation or use of a swimming pool, all required permits must be secured by a locally licensed pool contractor and all required inspections of the pool, pool barriers, and all electrical connections to pool equipment must be completed.
- 2. Prior to filling of the pool, a completed barrier must be in place, whether temporary or permanent in nature to ensure complete isolation of the pool area. Pools may not be filled until this barrier is in place.
- 3. Before receiving final inspections, the permanent barrier will be in place around the new facility with all required protection hardware either at the structure or at any access gates. Failure to comply within the permit term may result in a "Notice of Violation" and possible fines.
- 4. Pool permit will not be issued until a fence permit application has been received, processed and issued concurrently by the Building Department.
